African Blue Economy

- Generates nearly USD 300 billion,
- 49 million jobs associated,
- The continent has a vast coastline and abundant marine resources,
- Fisheries and aquaculture are vital sources of protein for millions of African people,
- Tapping into the potential of the AfCFTA for regional integration and cooperation.







The case of the ProFishBlue regional project:

Improving Fisheries Governance and Blue Economy Trade Corridors in the Southern African Development Community

- Total cost of the programme: USD 10.14 million with potential co-financing from GEF International Waters & Blue Economy financing window.
- Overall objective: Promote sustainable management of fisheries resources within the blue economy context to improve food and nutritional security, create employment through value chain activities, facilitate intra-regional trade, and build adaptive capacity against climate change and other external shocks.
- Project Validity: 48 months














Project Context

- Officially launched on 31 March 2022, Gaborone, Botswana
- Seven countries: Malawi, Zambia, Mozambique, Comoros,
 Zimbabwe, Madagascar and the United Republic of Tanzania
- Main counterparts
- Southern African Development Community (SADC) Secretariat SADC Technical Regulation Liaison Committee (SADC TRLC)
- Regional and national counterparts, such as Regulatory Competent Authorities
 Quality Infrastructure Institutions, Conformity Assessment service providers and
 private sector associations, mainly for Small and Medium-Sized Enterprises
 (MSMEs)
- Line Ministries in SADC Region (e.g. Trade, Industry, Agriculture, Fishery) and other actors, including women and youth organizations

Improving collaborative governance of transboundary fisheries and genetic resources

Policy harmonization and trade facilitation towards intraregional trade

Building climate resilience and institutional adaptability to shocks















 Component 2C "Provide business development services, accelerator, and incubation/investment support for women and youth SMEs in fish trade".




















The action draws on continental strategies and acts specifically in the areas:

- Optimized conservation and sustainable fisheries
- Responsible and equitable fish intra regional trade
- Develop communication strategies about blue growth as well as create awareness and develop human capacity











Expected Results

- Increased production and productivity of fish and fishery products
 - ✓ People benefiting from progress in fish value chains in the region (450,000 people increase)
- Increased share of market value for key processed fish and fishery commodities
 - ✓ Increased volume in cross border fish trade in the region (100,000 tons increase)
- Best management practices for transboundary resources governance (Blue economy strategies and investment plans developed)
